## ♦ Val's recipe

# Feather light lemon cheesecake

## Base ingredients:

- 2 cups digestive biscuits, crushed
- 4oz butter or margarine, melted
- 1/4 tsp each cinnamon & nutmeg
- I tablespoon sugar

### Method:

Mix all together & press into base of 8" or 9" springform cake tin

## Filling:

- 2 tbsp grated lemon rind
- ¼ cup lemon juice
- 14 oz can evap. milk, very cold
- 8 oz cottage cheese
- I level tbsp gelatine
- ½ tsp vanilla essence
- I cup castor sugar

## Method:

- I. Mix gelatine in ½ cup water & put cup into hot water to dissolve
- 2. Add lemon rind, then cool
- 3. Whip cottage cheese and sugar until smooth, then add cooled gelatine, rind & lemon juice
- 4. Whip evaporated milk to soft peaks in chilled bowl, beat in cheese mixture & vanilla essence
- 5. Spread over base, chill overnight

# Glaze:

- ½ cup lemon juice
- 1/4 cup castor sugar
- I tablespoon cornflour

## Method:

- I. Blend cornflour & juice in pan, add sugar, stir until thick
- 2. Spoon over cheesecake
